## ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

THIS CASE is before the Court on the Petitioner's Motion for Order to Show Cause filed on May 23, 2014, and upon consideration of such motion and the attached sworn affidavit and the Court's Order Placing Animals dated June 22, 2012, (hereinafter the "Order") the Court finds that:

- 1. The Order enjoined Respondent, Caboodle Ranch, Inc., a Florida not-for-profit corporation, (hereinafter "Caboodle") from possessing or having custody of live animals.
  - The Order was served upon Caboodle's attorney on June 22, 2012.
- 3. The Petitioner, the Hon. Ben Stewart, in his official capacity as the Sheriff of Madison County, Florida, (hereinafter the "Sheriff") has moved this court for an order adjudging Caboodle to be in Indirect Criminal Contempt of Court for the willful disregard and disobedience of the provisions of the Order by possessing or having custody of live animals since the date of the Order.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED AND ADJUDGED as follows:

Caboodle shall appear before this court at the following place and on the Ι. following date and time:

Date: June 27, 2014

Time: 8:30 a.m.

Place: Main Courtroom, Madison County Courthouse, Madison, Florida 32340, to be arraigned and then and there show cause why it should not be held in and punished for indirect criminal contempt of court, pursuant to Fla.R.Crim.P. 3.840, for its willful failure to comply with the terms of the Order. Such punishment, if imposed, may include a fine and/or incarceration or probation.

- 2. Should the court determine, based on the evidence presented at the hearing, that Caboodle's conduct warrants sanctions for civil contempt in addition to or instead of indirect criminal contempt, the court reserves the right to find Caboodle guilty of civil contempt and impose appropriate civil sanctions.
  - 3. Caboodle has the right to be represented by an attorney.
- 4. The Sheriff shall serve or have a copy of this order served on the registered agent for Caboodle and file with the court a return showing such service.
